Relevant Law in Respect of Legionella Control

- Health and Safety at Work etc. Act. 1974
- The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999
- The Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations 2002
- The Water Supply (Water Fittings) Regulations 1999
- The Water Supply (Water Quality) Regulations 2018
- Private Water Supplies Regulations 2016
- Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 2013

It is the responsibility of the duty holder/responsible person to:

- a. Consider that any changes to the system may alter the Legionella risk and therefore require a review of risk assessment, associated control scheme and records. This may result in:
 - a reassessment of the legionella risk
 - an update of the written scheme of control
 - a revised schematic diagram
 - a revision of the record keeping system
- b. Make appropriate notification under the requirements of the Plumbing Notification Laws.
- c. Ensure the necessary trade effluent discharge consent is in place for any effluent generated from any equipment installed.
- d. Ensure any preparatory work you are responsible for is completed prior to commencing plant and equipment work.
- e. Ensure any equipment is installed, commissioned, operated, and maintained correctly
